

CANDIN Reimbursement FAQ's

Question: How do I get reimbursed for CANDIN?

Answer:

1. Select the appropriate CPT Code*
2. Currently, **CPT Code 86485*** - *Skin test; Candida* – is the code available for the cost of the CANDIN and materials used in the skin test. This code does not include possibly related procedures such as office visits, injection, reading, or patient consultation.
3. Submit reasonable and necessary charges in accordance with, along with the current CPT Code.
4. The insurance company may ask for a copy of the invoice for the purchase of CANDIN in order to confirm the price.

CANDIN (*Coccidioides Immitis*) Spherule-Derived Skin Test Antigen

INDICATION AND USAGE

CANDIN® is a skin test antigen to assess cellular hypersensitivity to *Candida albicans*.

The product should not be used to diagnose or treat Type 1 allergy to *Candida albicans*.

WARNING: See full prescribing information for complete boxed warning.

The expected response to CANDIN® is a local area of inflammation at the site of the skin test. The reaction is usually dime to quarter size reaching maximum diameter between 24 and 48 hours. Larger accelerated reactions can occur, which may require treatment with local cold compresses and anti-inflammatory medication.

Systemic reactions can occur with skin test antigens and in certain individuals these reactions may be life-threatening or cause death. Emergency measures and personnel trained in their use should be immediately available. Patients should be observed for at least 20 minutes following the administration of a skin test. CANDIN® should never be given intravenously.
